- 7. Weather Forecast for Next 24 Hours by PMD. Scattered thunderstorm/rain of moderate intensity with isolated heavy falls is expected over the upper catchments of all the Major Rivers along with Islamabad, South & Southeast Sindh and Peshawar, Kohat, Bannu, DI Khan, Rawalpindi, Gujranwala, Sargodha, Lahore & Faisalabad Divisions.
