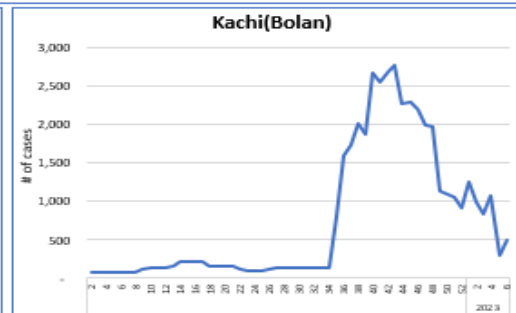

- **Population displacement due to floods:**
 - **Sindh province:** An estimated 29,692 people remain displaced from their homes and 5,132 people are living in one tent city established by the DDMA.
 - **Balochistan, KPK and Punjab province:** All IDPs camps are closed.
- **Presence of stagnant water following floods:**
 - **Balochistan province:** Patches of stagnant water present in few UCs of district Naseerabad, Jhal Magsi, Jaffarabad/ Usta Mohammad and Sohbatpur.
- **Disease outbreak a**
 - **Malaria:** Pockets of outbreaks of malaria reported from some UCs in Balochistan and Sindh province
 - **AWD/Cholera and Dengue:** Controlled, last confirmed case of Cholera was on 16th Jan 2023.

Number of Confirm Malaria Cases from Week 1, 2022 to Week 6 2023 (Source: DHIS-2/DMC)



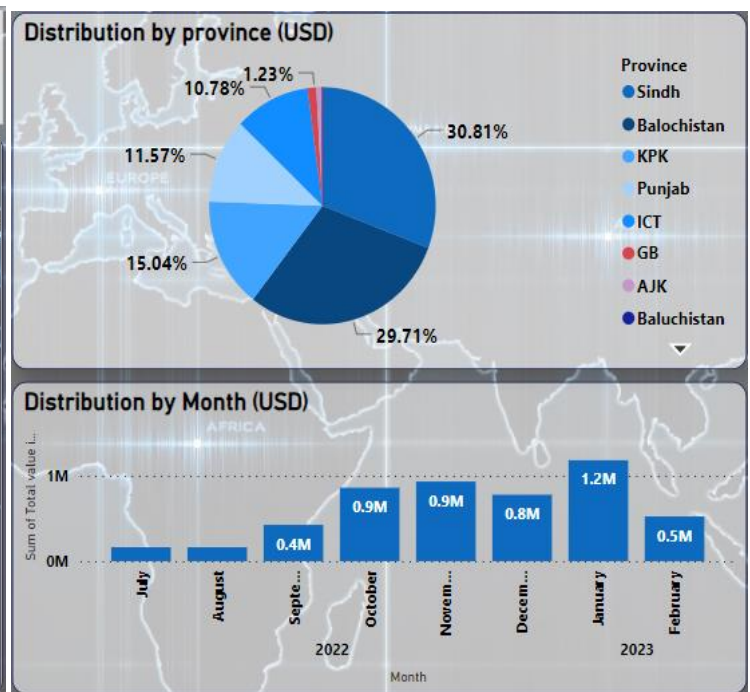
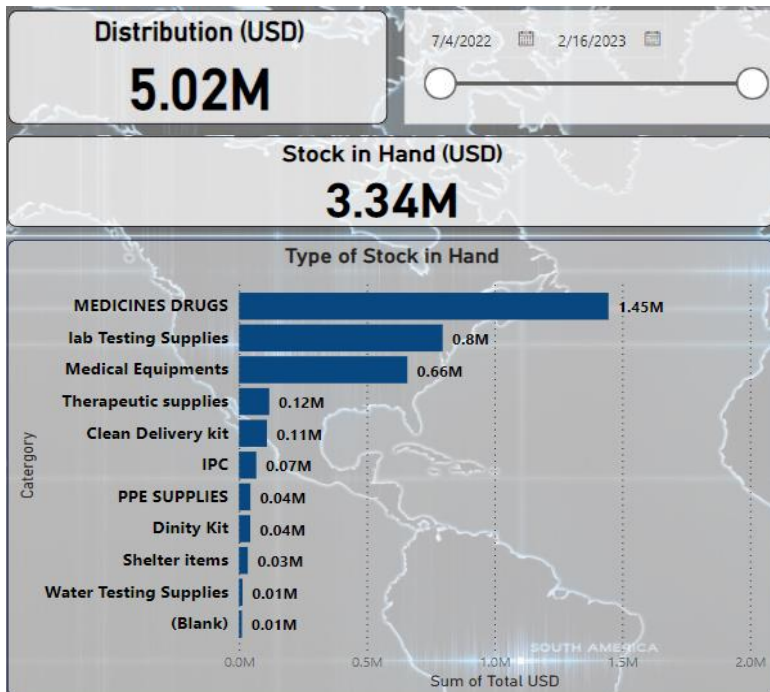


WHO RESPONSE

- Support to the management of Severe Acute Malnutrition (SAM) with complication (Epi-week 7):
 - 30 participants (11 Medical officers, 5 pediatricians, 12 Nurses and 2 MNCH and nutrition consultants) from 5 Nutrition Stabilization Centers (NSCs) of Balochistan were trained on inpatient management of SAM with complication.
 - 2 new NSCs (at DHQ hospital Tank and DHQ hospital DI Khan) became functional in KPK following renovation and training of staff. 1 existing NSC at DHQ hospital Chaman in Balochistan started providing NSC services this week.
 - 10,508 children under 5 with complicated SAM have been treated in WHO supported (newly established and strengthened) NSCs across Pakistan in flood affected areas to date. The performance indicators in these NSCs remain within WHO sphere standards.
- Support to response to pockets of outbreaks of Malaria in Pakistan
 - Distributed 11,760 Malaria RDTs to Hyderabad Hub (1800 kits), Sukkur Hub (1800 kits), Naseerabad EOC (1800 kits), Loralai (2400 kits), DI Khan (1200 kits) and DG Khan Rajanpur (600 kits).
 - Conducted Mass Drug Administration (MDA) and LLINs distributed in the areas with high malaria incidence
- Outbreaks of measles and Rubella
 - 356 new suspected measles/rubella cases were reported this week,
- Support to disease surveillance
 - Trained 56 surveillance officers from Sindh province on rapid response to outbreaks of diseases.

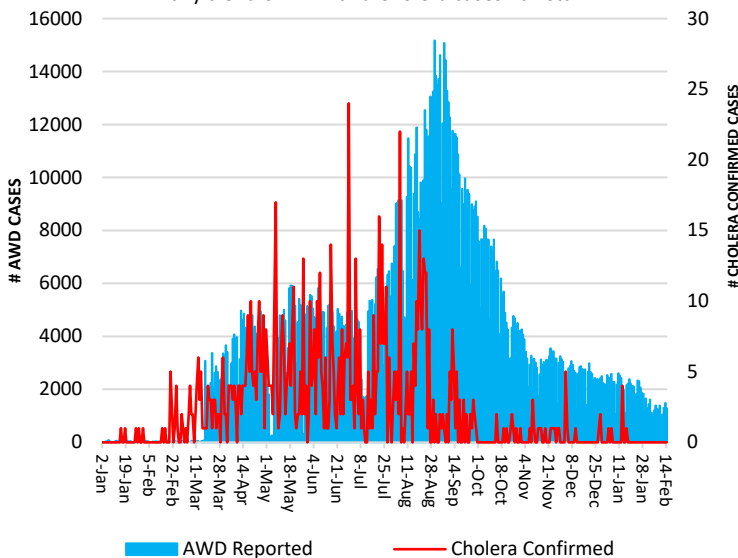

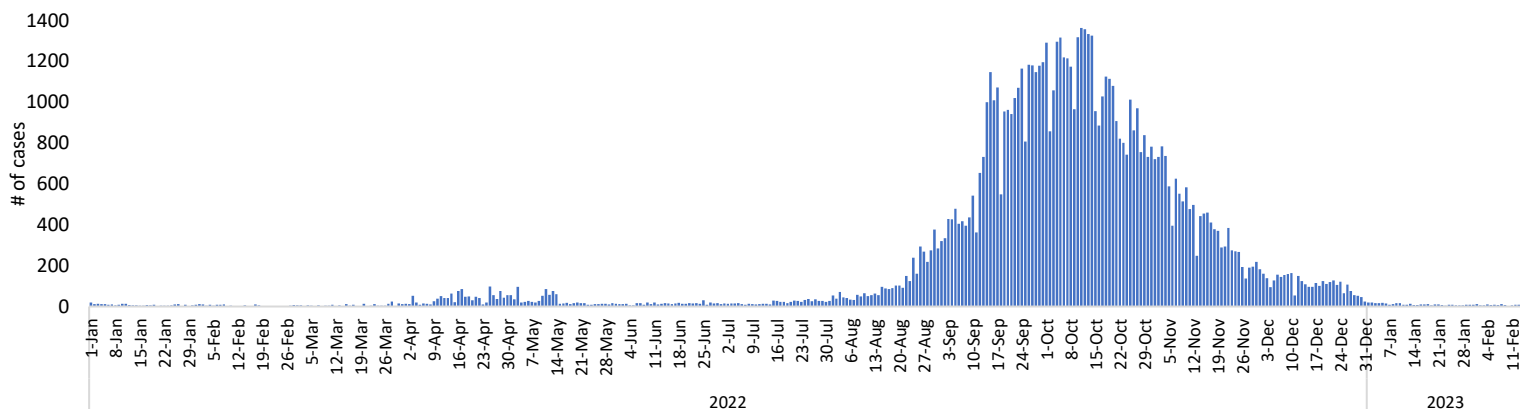
Daily trend of AWD and Cholera cases Pakistan
