7. **Weather Forecast for Next 24 Hours by PMD.** Scattered to fairly widespread thunder/storm rain of moderate intensity with isolated heavy falls is expected over Sindh. Scattered thunderstorm/rain of moderate intensity is expected over Eastern & Coastal Balochistan.

9. **Weather Advisory / Press Release**

a. In response to PMD press release NDMA has issued weather advisory to all concerned on 24th September 2021 Met Office informed that monsoon currents are likely to penetrate in Sindh from 27th September (Monday) and likely to continue till 02nd October (Saturday). Under the influence of this weather system:-

- (1) Rain-wind-thundershower is expected in Mirpur Khas, Thar Parker, Umar Kot, Sanghar, Thatta, Badin, Karachi, Hyderabad, Tando Allayar, Tando Muhammad Khan, Mitiari, Shaheed Benazirabad, Dadu, Kalat, Khuzdar and Lasbella from 28th September (Tuesday) to 02nd October (Saturday) with occasional gaps. Heavy falls are also expected in Karachi, Thatta, Badin, Dadu and Hyderabad during the period.
- (2) Rain-wind-thundershower is also expected at scattered places in Sukkur, Larkana, Jacobabad, Kohlu, Sibbi, Naseerabad, Barkhan, Zhob, Dera Ghazi Khan, Rajanpur and Bahawalpur during 28th September (Tuesday) to 30th September (Thursday).
- (3) Isolated Rain-wind-thunderstorm is expected in Kashmir, Gilgit-Baltistan, Islamabad, Northeast Punjab, Upper Khyber Pakhtunkhwa during 27th/28th September, 30th September (Thursday) and 1st October (Friday).

b. In response to PMD weather alert NDMA has issued weather advisory to all concerned on 28th September 2021 that that a low-pressure area (remnant of the Cyclonic Storm "Gulab") currently lying over central India is likely to track in northwest direction (towards Indian Gujarat area). The system is likely to re-emerge over the Northeast Arabian Sea by 29th September (Wednesday night) / 30th September (Thursday morning) and regain intensity due to favorable environmental conditions. Under its influence:-

- (1) Widespread rain-wind-thunderstorms with scattered heavy/very heavy falls extremely heavy at times are likely in Karachi, Hyderabad, Thatta, Badin, Mirpurkhas, Thaparker, Umerkot, Sanghar, Shaheed Benazirabad, Nosheroferoz, TMK, TAY, Dadu, Jamshoro, Sukkur, Larkana, Jacobabad, Shikarpur & Ghotki districts during Tuesday till Saturday (28th September - 2nd October 2021).
- (2) Widespread rain-wind-thunderstorms with scattered heavy/very heavy falls extremely heavy at times are likely in Bela, Awaran, Kech, Makran and Panjgur districts of Balochistan during Thursday till Sunday (30th September - 3rd October 2021).
